

For centuries, hymn writers and poets have found meaningful ways of describing that love of God. A poem by English writer Christina Rossetti simply but beautifully shares the Gospel truth that blesses this season.

Love came down at Christmas, Love all lovely, Love divine; Love was born at Christmas, Star and angels gave the sign. (*LW* 46:1)

Through the words of gifted hymn writers and poets and the evangelists Luke and Matthew, we hear the angels and we see the star. Once again, the message of God's love echoes in our world!


Titus 2:11–14







C hear our prayer.


P In the silence of this night, we remember all who have gone before us with the sign of faith. Bring us with them into Your nearer presence in paradise. Lord, in Your mercy,

T FROM DARKNESS TO LIGHT T

- P God's people of old looked forward to this night. As the psalmist wrote, "Some sat in darkness and in the shadow of death, prisoners in affliction and in irons, for they had rebelled against the words of God, and spurned the counsel of the Most high. . . .
- P Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress. He brought them out of darkness and the shadow of death, and burst their bonds apart. Let them thank the LORD for his steadfast love, for his wondrous works to the children of men!"



- P St. Matthew records in chapter 2 "When Herod had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Christ was to be born.
 "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written: "
- P 'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will be the shepherd of my people Israel.'" The Savior of the world was not born in the capital city of Jerusalem, but Bethlehem as God had promised.



- P St. Matthew records the angel's words to Joseph about the child to be born of Mary, his betrothed. "She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet:
- P "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"--which means, "God with us." No ordinary child was born this day. One day, He would accomplish the salvation of the whole human race.



What child is this, who, laid to rest, On Mary's lap is sleeping? Whom angels greet with anthems sweet While shepherds watch are keeping? This, this is Christ the king, Whom shepherds guard and angels sing; Haste, haste to bring Him laud, The babe, the son of Mary!

Why lies He in such mean estate Where ox and ass are feeding? Good Christian, fear; for sinners here The silent Word is pleading. Nails, spear shall pierce Him through, The cross be borne for me, for you; Hail, hail the Word made flesh, The babe, the son of Mary!



CANDLE LIGHTING (Please light your candles)

- P As the light of these candles lights-up our faces, it symbolizes the Light of Christ, a Child in the manger at Bethlehem, a Savior suffering our death on the cross, and soon to come from His throne on high as Judge of all. He is our Light here on earth and the eternal Light who enlightens heaven, where there is no need of candle or sun. Rejoice for the Light of the world has come, who transforms us with the brightness of His glory.
- P This is the message we have heard from Him and proclaimed to you: that God is Light and in Him is no darkness at all. [1John 1:5b] We are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and then cover its light. Instead they set the lamp on its stand, set up high, and it lights everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before all people, that they may see your good works and give praise to your Father in heaven. [Matthew 5:14-16]


HYMN OF LIGHT


