

The TOLLING OF THE BELLS



Canticle

(The term "canticle" refers to a hymn-like passage from Scripture other than the Book of Psalms. By the fourth century, nonbiblical canticles began to appear—including the Te Deum. The Te Deum was used as a morning canticle as part of monastic communities. Because of the widespread acceptance of Benedict's rule throughout Europe, the Te Deum was firmly established as a morning hymn of praise. It was often the hymn of choice at special events, such as the election of a pope, the consecration of a bishop, or the coronation of a king. In Martin Luther's 1538 treatise, The Three Symbols or Creeds of the Christian Faith, he included the Te Deum with the Apostles' and Athanasian Creeds.)
