
S: Christmas is Jesus' birthday. On this day Christian people, young and old, come together in God's house to worship their Savior. In Luke 2 the Bible tells us of the first Christmas service. The church was the field near Bethlehem. The congregation was made up of shepherds, dressed not in their Sunday best, but in simple shepherd clothes. The preacher was the angel sent from God. The message was the greatest ever given: "A Savior is born to you!" The music was sung by the heavenly choir of angels.

S: Christmas is Jesus' birthday!

- Yes! Christmas is Jesus' birthday! We see signs of Christmas all around us. We see the lighted candles. Christmas lights on the houses inside and out. The lights of the Christmas tree shine in the eyes of little children. We hear beautiful Christmas songs and hear church bells ring.
- S: It is Christmas, the birthday of the King! Jesus said, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them, for the kingdom of God belongs to them and is made up of such as these." Let the little children come. Tell them of Jesus. Tell them why the bells of Christmas ring, why the children sing, and why love fills the heart. Tell the world of Jesus, the Savior of all!

The Christmas Tree

- S: Martin Luther was one of the first to spread the use of a tree as a Christmas decoration. One Christmas Eve he was taking a quiet walk. Suddenly he saw a green tree shining in the silvery moonlight. He could not forget the beautiful picture. When he returned home, he brought in an evergreen tree and decorated it with shining candles.
- **S:** We think of the Christmas tree as being like Jesus, the Tree of Life. Its lights point to Jesus, the Light of the world. And we remember that the first Christmas gift ever given was later hung on a tree. For this is what happened when Jesus died on the cross.

Christmas Carols

- **S:** At Christmas time we hear and sing many carols. Carols are songs or hymns. Christmas carols help us show a true and deep Christmas Spirit.
- **S:** The oldest Christmas carol is "Glory to God in the Highest." The angels sang this song to the shepherds when Jesus was born.
- S: "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace, good will to men!"

Christmas Angels

- S: The Bible tells us of angel messengers who came from heaven to earth. They came both before and after Jesus' birth.
- S: The angel Gabriel came to Zacharias, the priest. He told Zacharias that his wife Elisabeth would be the mother of John the Baptist. John would tell many people about Jesus.
- S: This same angel later came to Mary, who was to be the mother of Jesus. An angel also came to Joseph, who would be Mary's husband.

Son of God."

Luke 135, NTV

S: "The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!"

But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God.

The angel said, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy-the son of God."

- S: What joy these heavenly messengers brought! Think of the shepherds on that holy night when an angel of the Lord came down to them. What sweet words the angel told the shepherds!
- S: "Don't be afraid! I have some happy news to tell you. For this very day a Baby is born in Bethlehem."
- **S:** This Baby is Jesus, the Savior.
- S: And suddenly there were with the angel many more angels, all singing praises to God.

Christmas Candles

S: A light has become the sign of a Christian's joy at Christmas. The shepherds in Bethlehem's fields saw the angel, and the glory of the Lord shone around them—a great, bright light reflecting the brightness and holiness of God Himself. Candles burn on the birthday of Jesus in honor and memory of Him whom the Bible calls the Light of the world.

Like a Christmas candle with its happy glow, we will shine for Jesus, For we love Him so!

Christmas candles in a row Make us think of Christ, you know. A light unto world below, He washes sins as white as snow.



SCRIPTURE READING

S: In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. And all went to be registered, each to his own town. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying.

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased."

When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them.

The Manger

- S: The manger scene is a lovely sign of Christmas. In our homes and churches, in decorations everywhere, on our Christmas cards, we like to see the stable, the manger with the Baby Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the cattle, the sheep, and the shepherds kneeling in worship. This sign can help us make our Christmas much more meaningful.
- S: We can do like the shepherds. We can look at the manger it is like God told us.
- S: The Christian family celebrates Christmas together, not only in church, but also at home. We can get together beside the Christmas tree and its gifts and there also worship the Savior in the manger.

Telling The Good News

- S: When the shepherds had seen the Baby, they told everyone about Him. This was the wonderful result of their visit to the manger. The shepherds had hurried to see the Baby Jesus for themselves. Now they knew that the Savior of the world had come, and they told others the good news.
- S: Our love for Jesus makes us want to serve Him and tell others about Him.



Christmas Stars

SCRIPTURE READING

Matthew 2:1-12 (ESV)

S: Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with Line and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of they where the Christ was to be born. They told him, "in Bethlehem of Judea, for so it written by the prophet:

And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, Are by no means least among the rulers of Judah: for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. And then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him." After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. And going into the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

- S: When Jesus was born in Bethlehem, Wise Men from the East followed a star and came to King Herod in Jerusalem, saying: "Where is this newborn King of the Jews? We have seen His star in the East, and we want to worship Him." Later the star that the Wise Men had followed appeared again. When they saw the star, they were very happy. It went before them and led them to the place where Jesus was living with Mary and Joseph.
- S: A bright star at the very top of a tall, shining Christmas tree is like the star that the Wise Men followed. It reminds us that we, too, may follow the star to find our newborn King.
- **S:** We, too, can worship Jesus and give Him gifts of our love and thanks.

SCRIPTURE READING

John 3:16 (ESV)

- S: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life."
- S: God so loved that He gave His Son that was the first Christmas gift! What love God showed when He gave us Jesus, who was later to die for the sins of the world!
- S: The gifts we give and the gifts we get at Christmas remind us of Jesus, the greatest Gift of all. Our reason for giving gifts is the same as God's reason for giving His Son. The reason is love. The Wise Men brought precious gifts to the Baby Jesus. We, too, want to bring our gifts to Him.

Jesus came, a little child; In His mother's arms He smiled. Men, led by Bethlehem's star, Brought Him gifts from lands afar. Christ, who came from Heaven above, Asks of us the gift of love.

God bless each child in all the world today Because of Him whose birth we celebrate, The child who, smiling, in a manger lay Seeming so small and weak, yet wonderous great.

God bless each household, father, mother, child. In every land let Christmas carols ring, Let church bells peal, and truth be undefiled, For Christ is born and evermore is King.
